



Gerda Wilson worked as a speech and language therapist here at the Warneford Hospital from 1966 until 1998 and was the creative energy behind the acquisition, renovation and development of this building – The Apple House. The Apple House became the unique, homely base for speech therapy courses to help people who stammer – intensive and initially residential.

With Gerda's inspiration and encouragement The Stammer Trust charity was formed in 1972 and supports Speech and Language Therapy work in the Apple House today.

Completely dedicated to her profession Gerda worked with hundreds of people helping them to discover fluent speech here, the joy of talking freely and to carry that treasure confidently into their lives.
